

Valla Beach Community Association Report

Valla Beach Road Intersection

"It is distressing that the intersection of Valla Beach Road with Giinigay Way has been the site of so many accidents over the past two years. Last month there was a serious accident involving a motorcyclist who has subsequently died of his injuries.

In response to this state of affairs, and much lobbying by the VBCA, local residents, and our local member, Michael Kemp, Transport for NSW and the State Minister are moving to make changes in order to reduce the safety risk. "All options are on the table" we are assured.

In order to make a sensible decision the TfNSW accident group has, for the month of July, installed a camera to record all accidents and near misses, as well as speeding. This is not for the purpose of issuing infringements but to gather data. Let us hope that changes are made to make the intersection safer for all of us.

Beach Driving

One of the main reasons we all love Valla and Valla Beach, and why people like to visit, is to appreciate the natural environment. Beautiful beaches, abundant wildlife, lush forests, and mild weather. We do really live in a paradise. But we must be careful not to love it to death.

The beaches are particularly fragile in certain areas. The estuaries are a haven for shorebirds, many of which are endangered. This is why we ask, and regulate, that these places are off-limits to dogs and 4WD vehicles. After some recently observed behavior I have to add motorcycles to that list.

But further, recent research has highlighted that all 4WD activity on a beach has detrimental effects as the weight of the vehicle crushes and kills all the life in the sand. This sand life is the basis for the birdlife and so the effects spread widely.

The beaches are a shared community resource and we have to consider how best to manage them, not just for us, but for future generations.

At present most beaches are available for 4WD access in NSW. We need to start a conversation to exclude them from some beaches. If you have an opinion please visit us at the VBCA information tent and let us know.

It was a picture perfect morning as the Valla Rural Fire Service Brigade members, VIPs and most importantly, the community, came out to celebrate the official opening of the new Station on Valla Rd.

Raffles, a barbecue, water play, old war stories and a short ceremony marked the occasion on June 29th.

New friends were made, old acquaintances renewed.

The historic event included a handover of keys to the brigade's new Cat 7 appliance as the old station had to be extensively upgraded to accommodate a new and larger Cat 1 truck.

The works included an additional bay, kitchen, training room, bathrooms and water tank. Renovations ran to the order of \$913,000 and Rural Fire Service (RFS) Superintendent Liz Ferris said the upgrade was in acknowledgement of a "great brigade".

"Our brave volunteers selflessly put themselves in the line of fire on behalf of their communities to protect lives and livelihoods," Supt Ferris said.

Citizenship, A letter to the Mayor

At the end of last year, the mayor joined us for our End of Year Celebration. We gifted him a copy of our Preschool history which was compiled and written by generations of Valla Preschool community and families for our 35-year celebration (in 2018).

At the start of this year Mr Gary Lee returned to Valla Preschool for our family day. He had been reading the book we gifted him and was hoping some children would sign it for him as a gesture of his connection to our Preschool community. The children were very happy to oblige but naturally had some questions...

Cove... I'd love to be the boss. I'd be nice to everyone on Gumbaynggirr land. The boss must work real hard to be the boss on Gumbaynggirr?

Zoe... We don't want to chop trees - if you do please don't do it again.

Cove... Gumbaynggirr is the specialist place on earth. I want to make sure he knows that.

Lotte... This land is special to the whole world.

Cove... I hope all the people in your area are safe. What do the people ask from you (in your job as mayor)? Where do you live? I think you might write a letter back after this.

Jack... Does he know about astronauts?

Kuka... I think the boss needs to look out for people cutting down trees and stop them.

Piper... Iwant you to know that fairies are real.

Nico... I love books. I'll tell him that I love the pictures, the words and just reading them.



And they have been shown the respect and care to answer them thoughtfully and individually. With the parting words from the Mayor - keep being curious, kind and proud of your community.

Next week I will visit with these children and share back the letter from the mayor. Perhaps it will lead to something else... further connection or another letter perhaps and maybe it wont. At the very least they will now identify further with being active citizens because they were respectfully seen and heard.

So, we penned him a letter to post along with the signed copy of the history of our Preschool. The children's curiosity around Mayor Gary Lee was evident, as well as their respect for the environment and passion to be custodians of the Gumbaynggirr land that they play and learn on. This is their land, and they want him to hear what is important to them - they are active citizens that will speak up for their own rights and the rights of the plants and environment.

And then today we got a reply. Their voices were respectfully heard and responded to by Mayor Gary Lee.

And once again I refer to our statement of intent to guide my thinking and help unpack my understanding of this encounter:

What kind of world do we want to live in? What kind of people do we want to be?

We all hope for a world where we are heard and seen. Where we can speak up for our rights and the rights of others. Heartwarmingly so, the children speak for the trees, other people in our community and even culture. They are telling us what kind of world they want to live in - one that is safe, where Gumbaynggir culture is respected, where trees and forests are protected. I think they also wanted to get to know Gary Lee too - they wanted to know more so they could relate to him and share what is important to them so he can relate to them too (whether that be fairies, a love of books or wanting to know what he knows about astronauts). They know how connection and relationships are formed.



How did you first hear about ShoreTrack, and what made you want to give it a go?


My brother came here for a bit and in year 8, I did a Girls Can Too program and I've loved ShoreTrack ever since.
